From 2018 2021, when I had dedicated spaces to work in, I was engaged in two bodies of drawing work that I was beginning to expand into a larger scale and to shift from drawing processes into painting. Since then, I have been without a studio. I've mainly been working on table top surfaces (dining room, kitchen) in my living spaces, so that while the two bodies of work have continued, the lack of space has necessitated that the work once again be made at a smaller scale and has placed a restriction on the types of materials that I can use most effectively.

 A larger studio space would allow me to go back to the trajectory I've had to put on pause.


