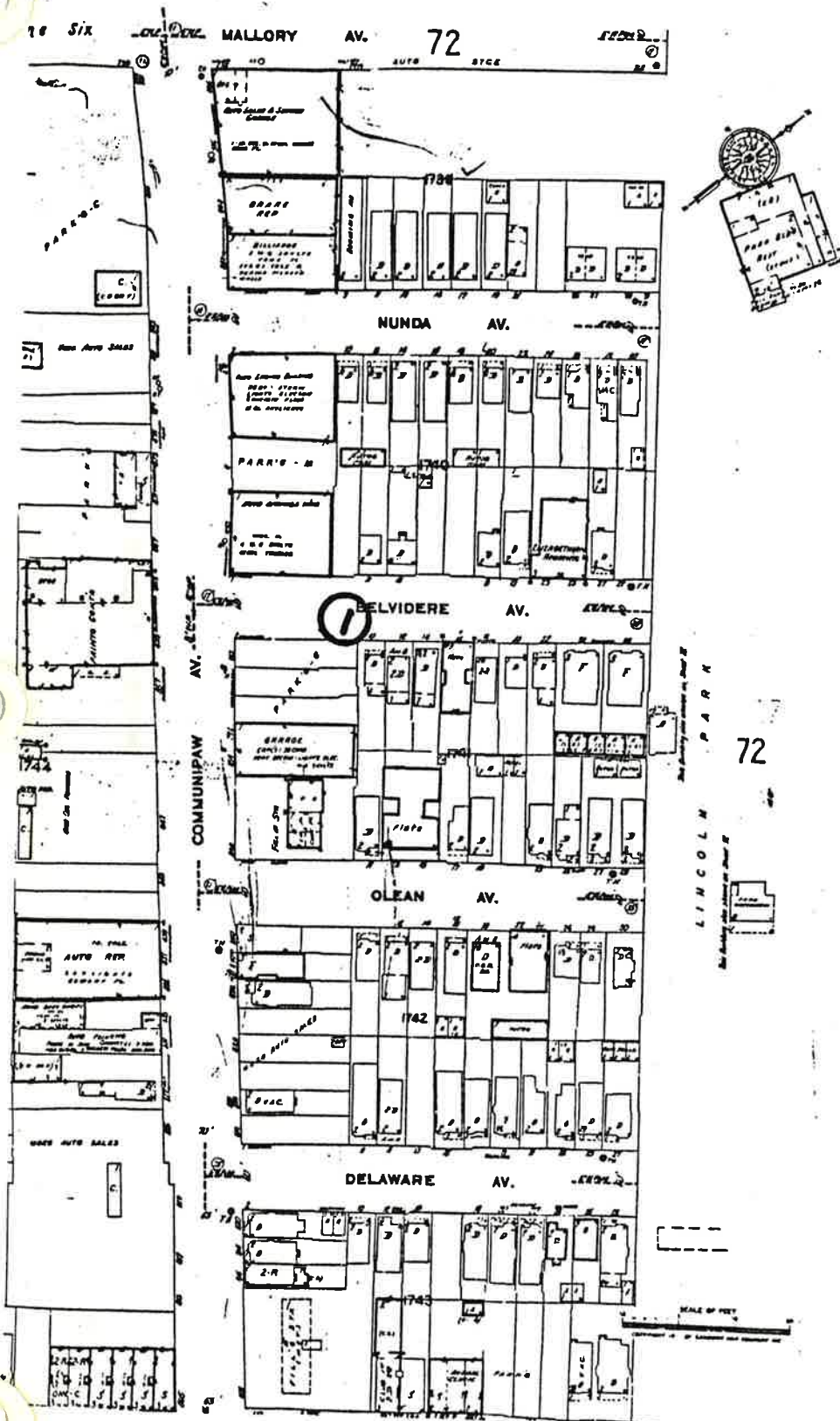

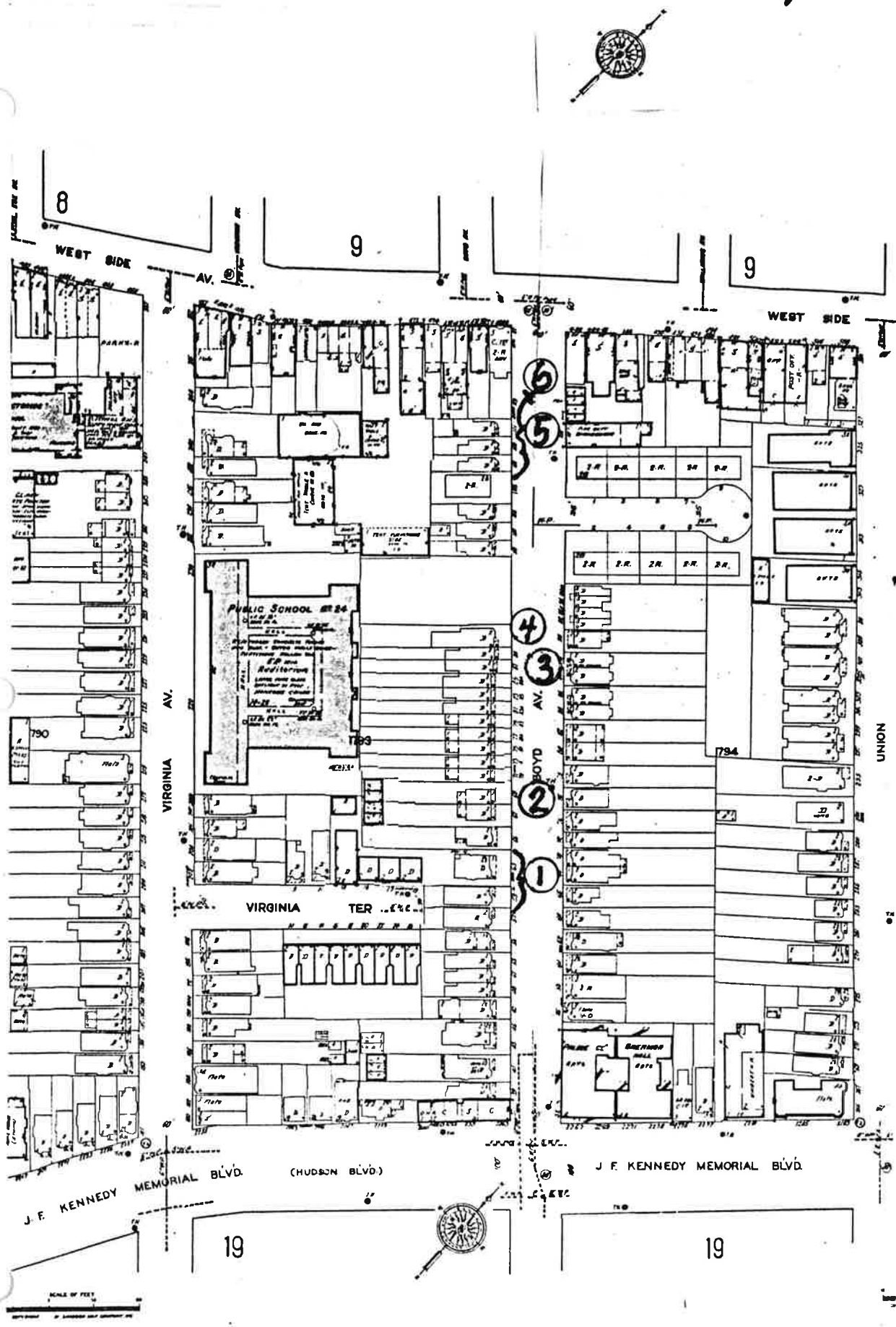

The porch roof is supported by 3 unevenly-placed wood columns, set upon rock-faced stone plinths. The attic story has a grouping of three double-hung windows, each with a pattern of intertwined arcs in the upper sash. Between the attic story and the second story is a sloping roofed overhang. The windows of the first and second floor are aluminum, double-hung.
